Nature of support Academic Year 2015/16

In 2015/16 the funding we received was / will be spent in the following ways:

- Training for Nansen staff to extend PE teaching practice.
- Employment of coaches to extend and sustain OOHL sports clubs
- Contribute to funding of local sports networks to access range of sports competitions
- Fund access to secondary PE specialist input for staff
- Provision costs for participation of pupils in holiday/OOHL sports activities in and beyond school
- Training for coaches and volunteers in support of sports provision
- Funding access to sports facilities locally to enhance and extend sports provision e.g. swimming baths
- Training and support of lunchtime supervisors' ability to enable games and sports activities
- Engagement of least active pupils or key groups through tailored provision and support.

Total = £10,830

Purchasing specialist equipment and teaching resources to develop a non-traditional activity or a new sport:

Measuring the impact of SPG spending

The school will be evaluating the impact on each pupil at the end of the summer term 2016. Evaluations will focus on the percentages of pupils that benefitted and the impact that the funding (over three years) has made on the curriculum. The forecasted results will highlight the sporting gains and how pupils' self-confidence has developed as a consequence of the strategies/activities provided.
