



Curriculum Overview— YEAR 2

Autumn 1 2019—2020



English

Theme: 'Land Ahoy!'

The children will be learning to:

- Gather information from non-fiction books
- Write a non-chronological report
- Write character descriptions
- Write poems
- Write postcards

At home: Read a variety of pirate stories and information texts about boats. Find out about the RNLI and tell your teacher all about the charity.

Maths

Theme: 'Number'

The children will learn to:

- Read and write numbers to at least 100 in numerals and in words
- Recognise the place value of each digit in a two digit number (tens, ones)
- Identify, represent and estimate numbers using different representations including the number line
- Compare and order numbers from 0 up to 100; use < > and = signs
- Use place value and number facts to solve problems
- Count in steps of 2,3 and 5 from 0, and in tens from any number, forward and backwards
- Recall and use addition and subtraction facts to 20 fluently, and derive and use related facts up to 100.
- Add and subtract numbers using concrete objects, pictorial representations and mentally, including a two-digit number and ones and tens, two digit numbers; adding three one-digit numbers
- Show that the addition of two numbers can be done in any order and subtraction can not
- Solve problems with addition and subtraction using concrete objects and pictorial representations

At home: Please practise to learn the 2, 5 and 10x tables and number bonds to 10

Science

Theme: 'Feeding and Exercise'

The children will learn about:

- Finding out about and describe the basic needs of animals, including humans, for survival (water, food and air)
- Describe how animals obtain their food from plants and other animals, using the idea of a simple food chain and identify and name different sources of food
- Describe the importance for humans of exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food and hygiene
- Identifying and classifying
- Performing simple tests
